Greetings in the name of our indescribable gift, our Lord Jesus Christ! We extend our heartfelt gratitude for your unwavering support and generous contributions toward the advancement of God's kingdom in the most remote areas of Andhra Pradesh and neighboring states in India. Your sacrificial gifts have made a profound impact, allowing us to reach new communities with the Good News, while also nurturing and strengthening our existing congregations. Thanks to your dedication and efforts, we are witnessing a daily increase in the number of Christians as new churches are being established in various villages. Your partnership in this mission has been invaluable, and we are truly thankful for your commitment. We pray that God continues to grant you strength and bless you abundantly, increasing your capacity to contribute further to this vital work in our region. Together, we can continue to spread the love of Christ and grow His church in these areas.

This month, we are pleased to report that 268 baptisms have been documented by our brethren working diligently across various districts of Andhra Pradesh and its neighboring areas. Additionally, 6 new congregations have been established, converted from different denominations in three distinct regions, taught by our preachers, Bro. Prabhudas and Bro. Satish. Our preaching brethren have successfully reached many new places with the Gospel. Evangelistic efforts included street evangelism and Gospel Meetings in various locations.

One notable place is G. Mamidada. One of the widows we support, named Dayamani from Rampachodavaram taught her relative, Sister Bala about one God, led her to the Church where she was baptised. Sister Bala then taught her daughter, led her to the Church, where she too was baptized. Recognizing the importance of sharing the Gospel with her family, Sis. Bala asked Bro. John Ratnam to conduct a meeting at her home. And we gladly accepted and we attended along with the ladies at Rampachodavaram congregation because of the widow and witnessed forty to fifty people gathering. After the meeting, they expressed a strong desire for the continuation of church in G. Mamidada, and Sis. Bala generously offered her terrace for worship gatherings. In response to this need, Bro. John Ratnam has sent Bro. Anil, who is working in the nearby village, to assist with the new congregation. Recently, three more individuals were added to the church at this location. Presently there are 7 members worshipping there with 10 to 15 attendance. Please keep in your prayers.



Another new congregation has been established at Pittachalam, initiated by Bro. B. Krupakar in the Visakhapatnam district of Andhra Pradesh. The preacher there, Bro. Prabhudas, was converted at Kattamuru during preachers' meetings led by one of our preachers. He reached out to request a meeting at

his venue to share the Gospel, ensuring that his entire congregation would have the opportunity to hear the truth where 18 more souls were added to the church. We are committed to strengthening Bro. Prabhudas in the doctrine of Christ, with Bro. Isaac assisting him in serving the congregation.

As a part of expansion of our work in other areas, we started a congregation at Chittoor town where some of our preachers in Tamil Nadu state were also present. After the meeting, we had



another meeting with the preachers. They all requested continual assistance and support. Also they requested construction of New Church Buildings and help for the completion of their buildings stopped in the middle due the lack of funds.



Please pray for this immediate need to expand the work of the Lord in this area. The expansion of our work in these regions is a testament to the collective efforts and faithfulness of our preachers. We acknowledge that this progress would not be possible without your continued prayers and support. Thank you for your steadfast participation in this noble work of the Lord.

DINING HALL & KITCHEN: We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all of you, dear brethren, for your



prayers and unwavering support regarding the Dining and Kitchen facility at the Children's Home in Rampachodavaram. Initially, we planned to construct a dining area with the limited area and plans were submitted accordingly. However, as the need for accommodating more children became evident, we decided to expand the project. The current building will now comfortably seat 250 children at a time.

Additionally, we are excited to share that a spacious kitchen has been established to prepare meals for the children. While it will take a couple of months to finalize the structure, we have made significant progress. Concrete slabs have already been erected, and we anticipate pouring the kitchen slab within the next two weeks.

Due to the presence of a steep valley measuring 25 feet, we needed to construct retaining walls, which have proven to be a time-consuming and labour-intensive undertaking performed manually, without the assistance of machinery. This added complexity has placed an additional burden on our budget, resulting in financial strain. Nevertheless, we are immensely grateful for God's grace, which has enabled us to persevere through these challenges and carry out this important work. Your continued support and prayers are highly appreciated in helping us navigate these difficulties and we are confident that the remaining tasks will be finished within the next two months.

All the children are doing well and are ready to return to school after their summer vacation. Please keep them in your prayers, as they require uniforms, books, and other essential supplies for their schooling.

We are also pleased to inform you that another boy has been baptized recently. Your support has provided these underprivileged children with a safe shelter, nourishing food, and a wonderful opportunity to learn about God and serve Him throughout their lives. Thank you once again for your kindness and generosity.



BECKY SEWING CENTRE: We sincerely thank you, dear brethren, for your support in establishing



the Tailoring Training Centre for young widows, equipping them to meet their household needs. Previously, we trained 10 widows, who expressed immense gratitude to the church for physically empowering them on their journey to becoming spiritually strong individuals. Currently, 15

young widows are undergoing training at the centre.

Your assistance has played a vital role in empowering these young women, enabling them to stand on their own when faced with adversity. One particular story that stands out is that of Sister Sujatha, a faithful



widow at Rampachodavaram. Her daughter, Divya, who has been married for three years and has a young son, found herself in a difficult situation when her non-Christian husband chose to leave her for another woman. Divya returned to her mother for support and has since

been attending the sewing centre with her son, embracing the opportunity to learn sewing skills.

This training has brought a renewed sense of hope and light into Divya's life during what has been an incredibly challenging time. She is regaining her confidence and slowly rebuilding her life. We are profoundly grateful for your contributions, which have significantly aided these women both physically and spiritually. Your kindness and support are making a remarkable difference in their lives, and for that, we thank you wholeheartedly.
